Whereas Lafayette Rodnett, of Hempstead County,
Arkansas,

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States, a Certificate of THE REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at Washington, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Lafayette Rodnett,

according to the provisions of the

Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the North East fractional quarter, and the North half of the South East quarter, of section two, in Township fourteen South, of Range twenty four West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Washington, Arkansas, containing two hundred and thirty three acres, and eight nine hundredths of an acre.

according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract has been purchased by the said Lafayette Rodnett:

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said

Lafayette Rodnett,

and to his heirs and assigns forever.
